



Cricket Chamber Orchestra

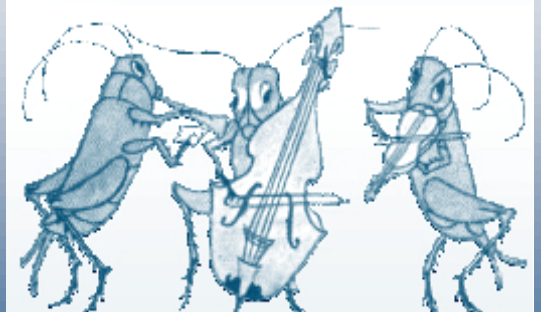

Workshop Information

The workshop will run from August 22 through to August 26, 2016, at the Hamilton Academy of Performing Arts at 108 Park Street West, in beautiful downtown Dundas, Ontario, from 10am to 4pm each day.

The workshop will consist of several components, such as development of orchestral and small group or solo performance skills in preparation for the concert planned for the last day. The selection and formation of small performance groups or soloists in preparation for the final concert. Additionally there will be classes providing intensive training on various topics pertaining to technique development.

Music for the orchestra component will be provided upon registration. Selection of the music for the group or solo component will be done on the first day.

The workshop is aimed at the development and enhancement of performance skills desired by the advancing student.

Summer Workshop Requirements

To gain the most out of this workshop, it is recommended that the student be working in Suzuki Book 2 or higher. Orchestra seating and selection of violin parts, will be assigned based upon the student's level indicated upon registration.

Instructors

Hungarian-born flautist **Máté Szigeti** received his training at the prestigious Franz Liszt Academy of Music (Debrecen, Hungary '97 B.A. and '09 M.A.). Mr Szigeti is currently the Music Director of the Hamilton City Ballet Orchestra, Cricket Chamber Orchestra and teaches flute at Hillfield Strathallan College and Hamilton Academy of Performing Arts (Dundas). He has most recently been appointed principal flutist with the Oakville Symphony Orchestra.

Hungarian violinist **Anita Hiripi** graduated the Béla Bartók University of Music, Miskolc. After performing with orchestras around the world, Ms. Hiripi is currently teaching at the HWDSB strings program and in Dundas at the Hamilton Academy of Performing Arts, Anita's Music Studio, and Long & McQuade. She is the 2013 winner of the The Hamilton Spectator Reader Choice Platinum Award as the best music teacher and is also the recipient of the Hamilton Community News Readers Choice Diamond Award.

András Weber received his musical training in Budapest, Hungary. His mentor, Janos Starker, has been a major influence in his work. He has been principal cellist with orchestras in Hungary, Mexico City and Canada, and has given concerts in North America, Europe and Korea. He is the principal cellist at Sinfonia Toronto "premier" chamber orchestra and the Canadian Sinfonietta. He is the founding member of Toronto Piano Trio and was member of the famed Arthur LeBlanc quartet.

Gordon Vanderwoude has studied piano and violin for over 15 years. He has been the organist and music director of Lowville United Church since 2008. He was formerly Concert Master of the Hamilton Philharmonic Youth Orchestra, and McMaster University Chamber. Currently, he is a member of the McMaster University Choir, plays violin in the Hamilton City Ballet Orchestra, and viola in the McMaster University Chamber Orchestra. Gordon is currently pursuing a Masters in Physics at McMaster University.
